The following is a guide as to the type of thing that your child would do in school. This can give you something to follow at home **if it suits you**. In school we would have a time each day for **Maths English and Irish** and three other curriculum areas: **Arts** (Visual arts, Drama and Music), **SESE** (History, Geography and Science) and **Wellbeing** (PE, Social Personal and Health Education and Goodness Me, Goodness You).

As we are almost at the end of term this learning guide has included activities for outside active learning for maths and language also.

MATHS: Number- counting, adding and subtraction with and without renaming (2nd class)

- Continue to practise to count to 20 (First class)

- The child can continue to mentally practise and say answers to $2+2=$ $3+3=$ $4+4=$ $5+5=$ $6+6=$ $7+7=$ $8+8=$ $9+9=$ $10+10=$ $11+11=$ $12+12=$. Also count up in 2's 2,4,6,8,10,12,14,16,18,20,22,24 and 3's - 3,6,9,12,15,18,21,24,27,30,33,36 or 4's 4,8,12,16,20,24,28,32,36,40,44,48 or 5's 5,10,15,20,25,30,35,40,45,50,55,60
- Continue everyday ask your child what day it is, what day it was yesterday and what day it will be tomorrow. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mXMofxtDPUQ> will support them with this. Children can discuss what the weather is like, what season it is and how they will dress
- Go outside and count how many giant/small/medium steps it is from your front door to the nearest tree
- Look at the car number plates, add the two digits together, what answer did you get?
- Look at the digits on the house numbers, add two single digits together and what answer have you?
- Find a leaf and count how many little sub leaves are there on it? Draw it and write the number, draw two and add them together or take them away
- Count how many steps you take to go to the end of your garden/road/shop etc.
- Count the cars in your area
- Count all the trees in your garden/road/area
- Practise adding/subtracting up to 100 using this game with a die:

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- 2nd class -subtraction and addition with renaming. Revise looking at previous video clips.
- Make up some addition and subtraction sums in your copy written the same way as in the video link to practise renaming e.g. $107-19=$, $94-29=$, $201-199=$, $25+47=$, $23+24=$, $29+14=$ etc.
- Develop and recall mentally taking away numbers between 0 and 20

LANGUAGE: English

Reading

- Tell your child you are going to read a story called '*Clark the Shark*' and ask them to predict what might happen in the story, show them the picture for this.
- The story for this week is '*Clark the Shark*' and can be accessed on storylineonline @ <https://www.storylineonline.net/books/clark-the-shark/>

Oral Language

- Look at the tongue twisters and rhymes at the end of the guide and try and say them

Ask your child the following questions before listening to the story 'Clark the Shark':

1. "Clark loved his life!" Tell me some of the things that are "awesome", "sweet" and "rock" in your life.
 2. Clark found life so exciting, but his best friend said, "You are making me crazy!". Why do you think Clark's friends stopped playing with him at break, lunch and circle time?
 3. Think about a time when you may have been too loud, too wild or just too much for your family or classmates. What happened?
 4. Clark got a big idea in his head to help him "stay cool". Do you think this was a good solution?
 5. Can you come up with a rhyme to help you out with your behaviour?
- **Opinion**
I would or would not like to have Clark as my friend? Why? Discuss. Pick two examples from the text to support this

Writing

- Children can write their own rhyme. Draw a picture.
- Write two ways in which Clark's school is the same as theirs
- Children to write why they would or wouldn't like to have him as their friend
- Children can complete a book report. Access 'twinkl.ie' free for parents now and put in book report template.
- Write news every day or about a topic of their choice
- Write about the weather

Word Search

Stick words underneath stones, and spread the stones around the garden. Keep a list of the words used.

Set a time limit, e.g. two minutes.

Allow the children to walk around in pairs looking under the cones, writing down as many words as possible using their clipboard.

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When the time is up they attempt to write a story using as many words as they can. If you wish you could allow the children a further two minutes to attempt to find more words for their story, or you could split the group in two and take turns.

- Answer the following questions: 1. Now you know a little bit more about surrealism, what do you think? 2. Can you name three surrealist artists? 3. What unexpected things would you put together? How about a tree wearing a scarf or a squirrel wearing a monocle? Draw your picture.
- Child can go outside and find a nice flower/weed/tree etc. and draw it and label it - keep a copy for these pictures and make a collection
- Find a flower/leaf of your choice, leave it in the centre of a book to dry out and when it is dried stick it onto card and make your own design on the card - pop it in an envelope and post the card to someone special

SESE: Science ideas

- In your garden see if you can spot any Blackbirds. Can you find any in your garden or do you see any close by on your walk for example? Always remember never to disturb a nest if you come across one.
- Ask mum or dad or whoever is helping you with your homework to help you learn three things about a Blackbird
- Have a **cool Scavenger hunt**, use your senses to find things. See attached to email for Scavenger hunt worksheet
